**PURPOSE:**

*NO SCHOOL LOGO OR SCHOOL AFFILIATION ANYWHERE ON CLOTHING or IT MUST BE COVERED COMPLETELY*

- Official SkillsUSA khaki work shirt and khaki pants is not required but if you have it, please wear it or:
- Work shirt or conference t-shirt tucked in
- Work pants or jeans (no holes), belt no sagging pants
- black, brown or tan leather work shoes
- Safety glasses with side shields or goggles. (Prescription glasses can be used only if they are equipped with side shields. If not, they must be covered with goggles.)
- JEWELRY: No dangling jewelry. Rings to be removed or taped over. HAIR: Long hair to be tied tightly to scalp.

**All tools to be inspected and approved prior to beginning competition by Judges. Any tool not in sound and safe condition to be replaced by competitor as directed. All unauthorized tools to be removed from competition area. Competitors who use non-authorized tools will be disqualified. Not bringing a listed tool does not disqualify a participant from competing.**

**COMMUNICATION or SUPPORT:**

Contestants to have no communication (talking, signaling, etc.) or support from instructors, parents or other contestants from the start of the competition until the end of the project build-out.
